Water Policy and Infrastructure Task Force Membership

SUBJECT: Transmittal of the Water Policy and Infrastructure Task Force Report

On behalf of the 29-member Water Policy and Infrastructure Task Force, I am very pleased to provide you this report culminating seven months of thoughtful and dedicated work that provides 17 recommendations detailing a comprehensive approach in addressing New Mexico's water future. The Water Policy and Infrastructure Task Force membership (listing with signatures attached) are water and policy experts, stakeholders, and government staff representing all regions of the state along with a broad and diverse water user constituency.

This report both informs, is complimentary to, and further addresses the 10 key recommendations and critical action steps that are described within the final draft of the 50-Year Water Plan that has received input from many of the same constituencies that have contributed to this report. In particular, the Indian Affairs Department (IAD) was a great partner with the Interstate Stream Commission (ISC) in providing extensive input through participation of the Tribal Water Working Group that developed its own report that speaks to indigenous communities views relative to the preservation, uses and traditional values of water and other natural resources within their homelands. Their report is reference in the 50-Year Water Plan and a number of the recommendations were incorporated in the Plan. I have been informed by IAD that the Tribal Water Working Group report will be released to the public at Indian Day, February 3, 2023.

I wish to acknowledge the valuable contribution from the Thornburg Foundation for providing resources to advance the process and the final work product through a grant provided to the Utton Center for a variety of support services that included the editing and publication of this report. The ISC engaged New Mexico First to provide meeting logistics and facilitation services that was instrumental in driving the consensus-based process to this very successful and highly informative conclusion. Many other contributors noted in the report provided technical assistance and research for the task force membership.

The report is organized by providing an Executive Summary, a description of the current drought and predicted climatological impacts to temperature rise, the organization and process of the Task Force's work, identified problems and proposed solutions, long-term opportunities, the Task Force's view on the draft 50-Year Water Plan, and the technical appendices. This work defines comprehensive and impactful solutions to water resources problems that have been plaguing New Mexicans for decades that will only get worse if corrective actions are not taken starting today and well into the future utilizing an "all of government" approach. Capacity development is a common theme identified within all three of the major categories investigated and it is the hope of this membership that the current level of state and federal resources are dedicated in a thoughtful and well-planned approach setting up long-term benefits that secures New Mexico's water future well into the next century.

The Water Policy and Infrastructure Task Force has achieved its Phase 1 goals in developing these recommendations and conveying them to the decision makers. Phase 2 of our work will now shift to serving as Water Ambassadors in their respective regions conveying the findings of our work and advocating for implementation and they offer their support to the Governor's Office to assist in advancing New Mexico's water policy and infrastructure agenda going forward.
