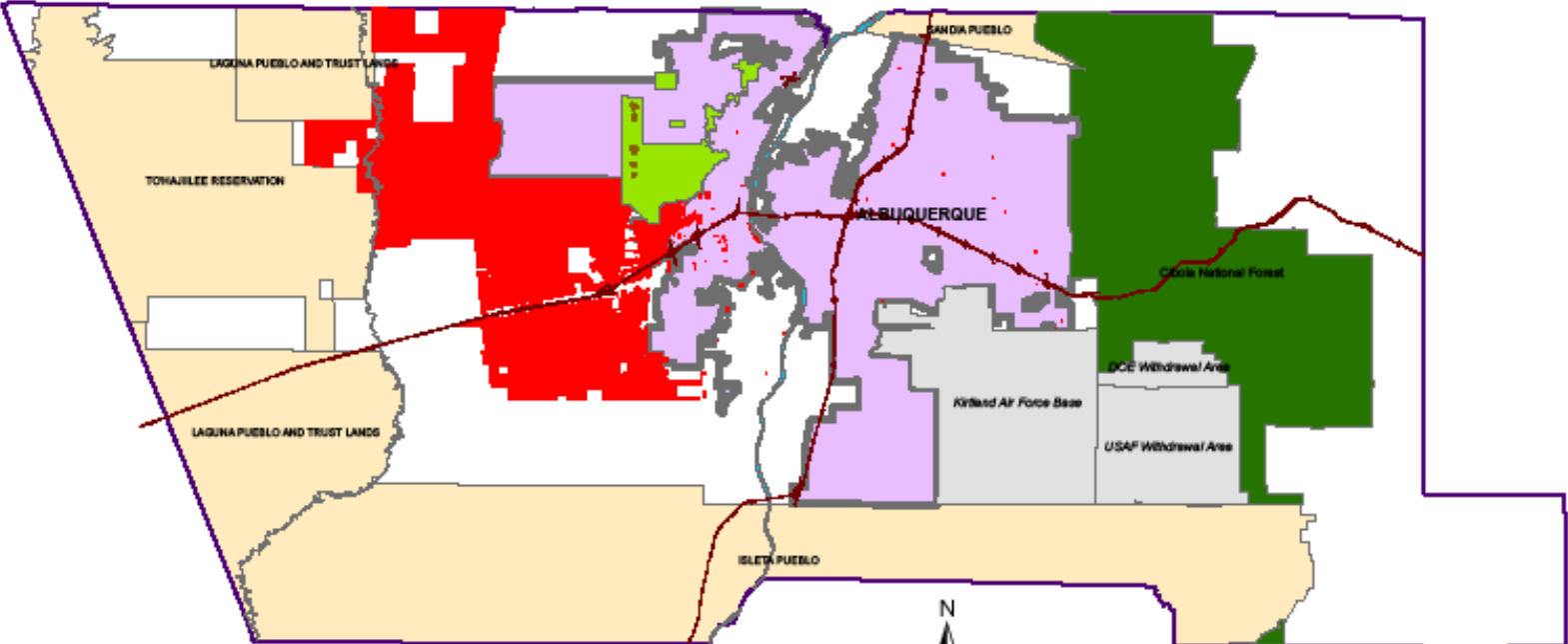
The Disconnects

- ❑ Connecting plans, regulations, development decisions and actions as well as financial resources



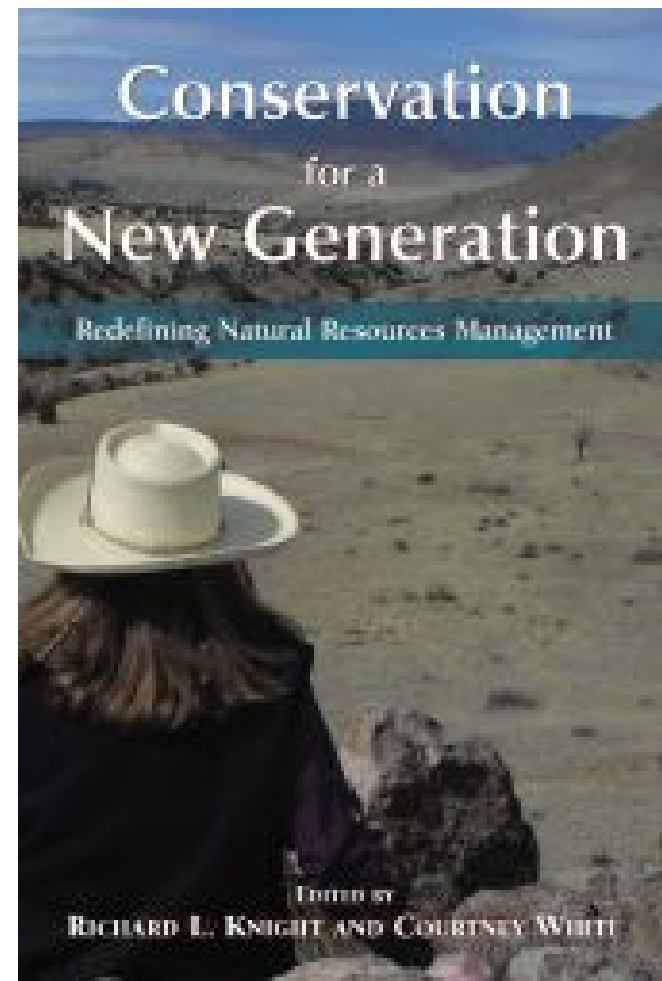
A smarter process requires, at a minimum:
